Sermon Application Questions from Sunday's Message

On Sunday, Pastor Miles started the "At The Movies" series with his first message focused on the movie Woodlawn. Woodlawn is a movie about a football team who comes to faith in Jesus while living in the midst of a town divided over racism.

At the beginning of the movie, a chaplain joins the team and challenges the team to believe in Jesus. After their conversion, the team then begins to evangelize their school, coach, and rival team. The climax of the movie comes when the overseer of the school district attempts to silence prayer during the highest attended game of the year. Despite the overseer's efforts to silence prayer before the opening kick-off, the whole crowd, along with the rival coaches and chaplain, recite the Lord's Prayer in a spectacular way.

In the movie, the chaplain didn't have any particular skills or eloquent words in coaching football. However, he was bold in his purpose to share Jesus with the football players and be their chaplain despite initially being rejected by an unbelieving coach. In your group discuss the following:

1. What group of people do you believe God is calling you to minister to? (ex. friends, coworkers, etc.) and what steps are you taking to minister to those people?
2. Read Matthew 28:19. In this passage we see Jesus challenge the disciples to make disciples. Are you making disciples?
3. If you are still unclear of the people to whom God is calling you to minister, in your group spend some time in prayer and ask God to identify those that He could be leading you to reach with the love of Jesus.
